Rites Held at Pine Level for Taylor Native

(The Taylor County News and Butler Herald, Friday, May 15, 1964)

Funeral services for Mrs. Missouri Ann Pike Blackston were held in the Pine Level Methodist Church, Thursday at 3 p.m. with the pastor of the church officiating. Internment was in the family lot of the church cemetery.

Mrs. Blackston died at the home of her son in Phenix City, Ala., Tuesday at 1:20 p.m.

A lifetime resident of Taylor County, she was the daughter of the late John Thomas and Elizabeth Morris Pike. She was born January 22, 1897. Mrs. Blackston was a member of the Pine Level Church.
